

Sloatsburg Inn named a top global destination by Conde **Nast Traveler**

Rockland County is having a moment.

First, Karenderya, a modest family-owned Filipino restaurant in Nyack, was named as one of Esquire magazine's top 20 best new American restaurants.

Now, the Valley Rock Inn & Mountain Club in Sloatsburg has been named among Conde Nast Traveler's 9 Best New Boutique Spa Hotels.

The only U.S. property named, it ranks right up there with the Euphoria Retreat in Greece, and Tanzania's Zuri Zanzibar.

Valley as a luxe fitness and wellness destination."

The property has a dozen historic house and barn buildings that form a wall around an interior garden. Guests stay in one of four renovated guesthouses (with a total of 17 bedrooms), and there's an organic market and two restaurants that source organic produce from the Inn's own fields. Popular with locals and guests this winter are its pop-up Apres Ski Lunches, held outdoors.

As for the spa quotient, there's a 75-foot pool, a 7,000-square-foot gym, guide-led hiking, biking and kayaking programs, as well as a roster of wellness and fitness programs, spin classes and boot camp. This summer, massage rooms are planned just beyond the pool.

The Journal News toured the property with Bruno before it opened back in 2017.

His goal, he said, was to entice tourists — especially New York City dwellers who enjoy hiking and cycling in nearby Harriman park — to think of Sloatsburg as a weekend destination

"People don't realize how lush and beautiful it is here," said Bruno, a Tuxedo Park resident, who got the idea to redevelop the property once he discovered that its location was easily accessible to the state park without having to navigate heavily trafficked Route 17.

"I thought cyclists and hikers might really like this, but there was no ground zero for the cycling world here. Once I realized there was an audience I could market to, it was worth going all in."
